Dear Residents, Family, and Friends:

This communication is difficult to write, as we were hoping to have better news for all of you. Although our concern related to COVID-19 and the protection of our residents is, and will continue to be, our top priority, we also know that social isolation has negatively impacted aging adults during this time.

**This afternoon, Governor Gretchen Whitmer extended Executive Order 2020-108 (now EO 2020-136), restricting visitors to all areas of our campus through July 24, 2020 unless for serious, critical, and end of life situations.**

We will remain diligent in infection control practices, and ask that you do as well. This virus is incredibly contagious, and we have seen the devastating impact throughout the country and around the world. As our communities start to open again, the risk increases, and we can only ask people to continue to perform hand-washing of at least twenty (20) seconds, wear your mask when out of your home, and hold others around you to the same standards. In order for our residents to be able to enjoy the simplicities of life again, we must do our part in order to decrease the number of positive cases. I have started to see mask-wearing in public decrease, and it concerns me. We have all heard of asymptomatic cases of COVID-19, where someone may not show signs and symptoms of the virus, but can still be contagious and test positive. In order to avoid this, you must avoid coming in contact with someone who may carry the virus—this can be anyone. Wear your mask. Wash your hands.
